

On June 7, 2016 the Katy Area Districts Council held its First Annual Projects Awards dinner. The Katy Area District Council's mission is to promote water conservation, grow educational opportunities for the Katy area water districts, improve economic development opportunities and especially to enhance the quality of life for the Katy Area. The Council strives to promote cooperation and communication among the districts in general and for community infrastructure projects.

All districts must have made significant contributions to the Katy area community in order to be recognized.

The four categories are:

Landscaping, Parks and Trails

Roads and other Public Infrastructure

Water Conservation

Water and Waste Water Facilities

The districts were categorized based on their size or district type:

- I. Water District I: Less than 500 water connections
- II. Water District II: 501 to 1,000 water connections
- III. Water District III: 1,001 to 1,500 water connections
- IV. Water District IV: 1,500 water connections and up
- V. ESD, Improvement District or Other District not including Water
